Mobile App

Take the Library with you. Search the catalog, manage your account, borrow streaming movies, music, ebooks and audiobooks.

Wireless - free wireless Internet access at all library locations.

Databases - resources with quality content; many include full-text newspaper, magazine and journal articles for research, or facts and answers on topics ranging from business and health to reading recommendations and test preparation. Most are accessible from home using your library card number.

Tutor.com - highly qualified tutors available from 3-11 pm for a wide variety of subjects, practice quizzes, and resume and essay help.

Lynda.com - an award-winning library of video tutorials designed to help people who want to gain specific software, technology, creative, or business skills. Tutorials include game design, infographics, 3D and animation, CAD, and programming.

Services for Youth

Each of the Library's locations offers a full range of services for youth. The children's sections offer the opportunity to educate and entertain your children from birth through grade six with programs, music CDs, DVDs, audiobooks, books for all age levels in fiction and non-fiction, early learning computers, and databases.

Kits for Kids are designed for toddlers and preschoolers age two and up, their families, caregivers and teachers. Kits contain theme-centered books, media, and toys.

Every library location offers a section for teenage readers, ages 11 to 18. The teen areas include the newest selection of teen fiction books, teen magazines, audiobooks, music and DVDs. We also offer craft, gaming and other programs. (Not all teen sections have non-fiction.)

Both children and teens are encouraged to take part in our **annual summer reading program and events.**

Services for Adults

All of our locations offer large selections of fiction and non-fiction books, magazines and newspapers, music CDs, and audiobooks.

We offer a wide range of databases for personal and professional use such as Ancestry, Hoover's Online, MEDLINE, and Legal Forms Library.

We also present programs on many topics related to personal interests, learning, entertainment, and cultural pursuits, including

book discussion groups and author visits. The Events Calendar, which is accessible via the Library's website, makes it easy to search by location, age level or date. **Book Club To Go!** is available at Main Library. Small tote bags with ten copies of the same title are perfect for book discussion and contain discussion guides to get the conversation started.

Special Collections is located at Main library and is the place to go for comprehensive local history and an extensive collection of genealogy material.

Services for Educators

Books in Boxes - primarily for elementary school classes through grade 6. Each set consists of 35 copies of a paperback title packed in a box, which circulates as a unit and may be booked through the Children's Library at Main. Lists are on the Library website.

Resources for Early Childhood Educators (RECE) Lab

- houses equipment for educators, early childhood caregivers and homeschoolers, including 2 laminators, a binder, and three Ellison die-cut machines. Classes are given for educators; some include continuing education credits.

Teen Classroom Sets - each set consists of 35 copies of a popular title packaged in bags and are circulated to teachers for 1-6 weeks. Book a TCS through the Teen Division at Main. Lists are on the Library website.

Librarian visits - available for classrooms preschool through university. Activities include instruction, story times, and book talks.



Specialized Services

Computer and Internet Training - free training programs from entry level such as introduction to computers and basic Word through advanced topics such as Excel pivot tables.

Grant Center - part of the Foundation Center's Cooperating Collections. The Non-Profit Resource Center at Main houses a core collection of materials on grant seeking and funding.

Health Information Center - located at Main Library offers the general public access to health and medical information in a variety of formats. The librarians and other public service staff in that area are Consumer Health Information Specialists, certified by the Medical Library Association, and can help you locate up-todate, evidence-based health information.

Librarian visits - available for community groups with presentations on a variety of subjects. Additionally, groups are welcome to visit for a tour and/or program.

Library by Mail - Library Express Delivery Services (LEDS) delivers items by U.S. postal service free of charge for those who cannot get to the library. For more information, call 330-643-9060 between 8 am and 3 pm.

Microbusiness Center - provides accessible business training, educational resources, and individualized direction to entrepreneurs, students, and established business owners and offers co-working space to contemplate, cultivate or expand a business or business idea.

Notary Services - available at Main Library

Passport Services - Main Library and Nordonia Hills Branch are Passport Acceptance Facilities through the U.S. Department of State. Detailed information is on the Library website.



Patent and Trademark Resource Center -

provides access to resources from the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office in a variety of formats. Highly trained librarians teach classes and help with your patent or trademark quest at Main Library.

TechZone@Main - maker area located at Main Library offers a vinyl printer/cutter, button maker, sewing machine, 3-D printer, laser engraver, audio recording studio, green screen, audio-video transfer station, photo studio in-a-box and much more.

Services for all Ages

Document Services - a variety of document services are available including photocopying, printing, scanning, faxing and mobile printing.

Events Calendar - discover what is happening at all Library locations. You may search by location, age level or date of program. Located on our website under Events.

E-mail or Text Notification - customers may receive arrival notifications of requested materials and an automatic reminder a few days before items are due.

Friends of the Library - volunteer groups at each location. They're a great way to get involved with fun activities and fundraising events.

Interlibrary Loan - three convenient Interlibrary Loan options, SearchOhio, OhioLINK, and traditional interlibrary loan, are available if you've searched our catalog but can't find what you need.

Mobile Services - bookmobiles visit schools, daycare centers, Head Start programs and neighborhoods year round. Our van visits senior citizens in housing facilities or retirement communities. Meeting Rooms - Library locations provide meeting room spaces for library-related activities. When not needed for library events, they are available for non-profit community groups. Main Library offers meeting rooms for use by for-profit companies or groups for a fee.
